British Cycling 'National Road Cycling Championships' comes to Redcar and Cleveland

For the first time in its history Redcar and Cleveland will host the British Cycling 'National Road Cycling Championships'.

The action hits the streets of Redcar on **Friday 23 June** with the circuit races, a technical 1km town centre circuit race starting on the seafront and then heading down the High Street. The women's races start at 6.30pm and finish at 7.30pm and the men's races start at 8.00pm and finish at 9.00pm.

The road races, starting and finishing in Saltburn on **Sunday 25 June**, will conclude the championships and challenge the riders with its steep gradients and hairpin bends. Both the men and women will follow an 18.8km loop, with the women completing seven laps to cover 132km, and the men taking on 10 laps and 189km. The women's race begins at 9.00am and the men's race starts at 1.30pm.

Cycling fans across the country will be able to follow all the action from next week's British National Road Championships in Redcar and Cleveland, with British Cycling providing flag-to-flag coverage of the road and circuit races through GCN+, Discovery+ and YouTube, plus a full highlights programme on ITV4 on Thursday 29 June at 6pm.

The National Cycling Championships showcases top class athletes, some of whom compete in the highest level of professional cycling (World Tour Level). Over the years the event has attracted Tour de France winners, Olympic and World Champion medallists such as Lizzie Deignan, Sir Bradley Wiggins, Chris Froome, Mark Cavendish and Geraint Thomas who all battle it out to wear the national champions jersey, the first race of which it can be worn being the Tour de France. The event also includes a series of mass participation events, legacy and celebratory events and community participation activities before, during and after the races.

A total of 10 coveted national champion's jerseys are up for grabs across the three days of racing from 21-25 June. The road races will conclude this year's championships on Sunday 25 June, starting and finishing just after Saltburn Bank.

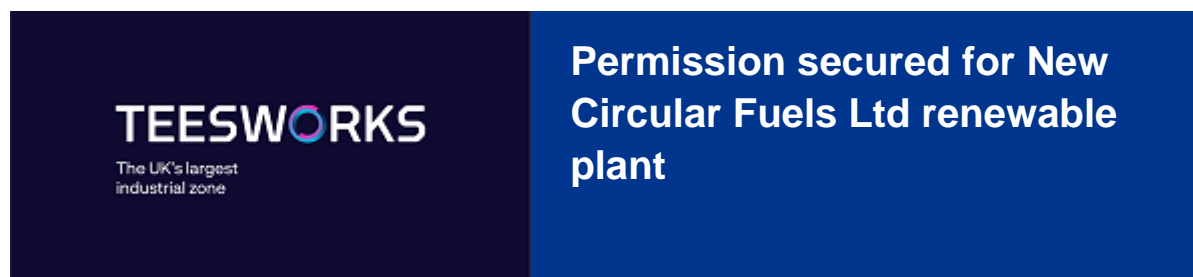

A cutting-edge fuel-from-waste facility has taken a huge step forward at Teesworks after plans were officially approved this week.

Circular Fuels Ltd is to create a ground-breaking low carbon plant on land at Dorman Point – with 250 construction jobs and more than 50 skilled roles to come, and many more indirect jobs to come via the feedstock supply and fuels offtake supply chain.

When fully up and running, the £150million plant will be able to produce 50,000 tonnes of fuel per year from 220,000 tonnes of non-recyclable household and industry waste by converting it into a safe, cost-effective, and clean burning fuel.

A bid to secure planning permission for the plant was officially granted by Redcar & Cleveland Borough Council on 31 May.
