Redcar & Cleveland College have opened the doors to its Clean Energy Education Hub, part of a recent £6.5m investment in college facilities.



The college has worked in collaboration with Redcar & Cleveland Borough Council and industry

The Clean Energy Education Hub has received a capital injection of £2.4m from Redcar Town Deal, as one of its flagship projects to improve and develop Redcar.

Materials Processing Institute launches venture arm to commercialise innovation

The South Bank based Materials Processing Institute has launched a new venture arm to generate additional investment to expand its research across the foundation industries.

Potential areas for commercialisation include the reduction of iron oxides using hydrogen, recovery of critical materials, including lithium, from used batteries, reducing nitrogen levels in steelmaking, and advances in powder metallurgy.
