New regulations for trade waste



The law has changed in England which requires businesses to recycle a core set of recyclable materials.

By law, businesses are required to manage and dispose of their waste in a responsible manner. The benefits of doing this effectively includes helping in the effort to tackle climate change and enhancing your image and customer retention.

If you have **10 or more full-time equivalent (FTE) employees** you had to be compliant with the new legislation by **31st March 2025**.

If you have fewer than 10 FTE employees in total across all of your premises, you must be compliant with the new legislation by 31st March 2027.

What is the new legislation?

The new legislation in England requires the following types of wastes to be separated in accordance with the arrangements made with your contracted waste collector:

- **Food waste** must be collected separately from other waste.
- **Dry mixed recycling** includes plastic, metal, glass. paper and cardboard.
- **General/residual waste** includes non-recyclable materials.

Keep in mind that all businesses produce some food waste. The Government hasn't set a minimum food waste weight before the new legislation applies, so it's likely that these changes will also apply to your workplace if you had **10 or more full-time equivalent (FTE) employees on 31st March 2025**.

Please speak to your contracted waste collection provider, who will advise you on what collections they are able to provide and answer any questions you may have regarding the new legislation.

Redcar & Cleveland Borough Council has approved a planning application for nearly 150,000 sq ft of new technical and manufacturing space, laboratories and offices at the Wilton Centre in Redcar.

The buildings will be inside the boundary of the Teesside Freeport so their occupiers will benefit from a range of incentives, including savings on stamp duty, business rates and National Insurance contributions.


